Points of Discussion

For the session on All Political Parties – the senior most leader present from the respective parties can be considered as the representative & it can be headed by present/ former Speaker / Chairperson. It should be on 1 day (1 session) only. The themes of discussion can be on issues of current national importance or those affecting the federal polity, to list a few like electronic voting, internet based, Banning of EVMs, one country one election, role of legislatures in the assemblies, role in law making, strengthening the committee system on deliberations, anti-defection law and need for reforms

and Whip system.

Session on pressing issues of Global concern, let there be at least 4 themes, like session on Global Economic Slowdown, Climate change, Security challenges and Industry 4.0 Develop a common theme, to weave the above themes in one. It should be presided over by the Deputy-Chairman, Rajya Sabha. The speakers to be shortlisted, for these Global Sessions, should be persons of international repute and keenly listened with respect, like to a few – Geeta Gopinath, Abhijeet Banerjee, Nandan Nilekani, Bill Gates, Jeffrey Sachs, Ruchir Sharma etc.



Some key suggestions are inviting at least one representative from SAARC countries. One session can be planned on the vision of NLC, Bharat, how we propose to institutionalize it and what benefits the legislators can draw from it. Thinking for NLC, Bharat 2024, few states which can be thought for with large convention centres are Telangana, Karnataka, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and Gujarat. Re-think on the number of themes and sub-themes it can be reduced to 8 themes and 32 sub-themes, each theme should have a concept note, pointers for discussion and a clear outcome-oriented discussion. We can come up on a small booklet on it.

On Badges for guest, use good design with clear – photo, name (if long – ask for an abbreviated one), state, minister, bar code. On Volunteer there must be Uniform Volunteer badges, uniform dress code, proper training on mannerism/hospitality.

On session documentation committees there must delegation of clear responsibilities to the report writing committees to minutely document the proceedings and discussion at various sessions. There should be a standardised format to be followed for documentation and one person to be responsible to collate the data.

A centralise strong control room to be established for an emergency, for LOs movement, vehicle information, emergency cancellation of tickets / rebooking etc. A bio-data book of all the participants to be prepared, so that they can form a lifelong relationship. A protocol officer to look for necessary protocols on sitting arrangements and dice arrangements. A 'Mumbai Heritage Tour' can be thought of to showcase the host city.
