

Introduction: National Legislators' Conference Bharat

National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat) is a groundbreaking platform designed for Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs) across Bharat to convene and exchange ideas in a historic setting. The inaugural edition of NLC Bharat was held in Mumbai from June 15-17, 2023, bringing together legislators from all political parties and regions of the country.

The first edition was crafted with the primary objectives of fostering cross-learning and enhancing legislative effectiveness with participation of 1800 MLAs' / MLCs'. The participants gained invaluable experiential learning through a combination of thematic discussions, large-format plenary sessions, and dynamic parallel sessions. The event also featured pavilions showcasing commendable practices from various States and Union Territories, enabling extensive informal interactions among legislators, party leaders, Bharat's Living Icons, and CSR representatives.

The conference included sessions focused on strengthening democracy, featuring insights from both national and global leaders. Additionally, it provided a unique opportunity for MLAs and MLCs to creatively present the cultural richness of their regions. In a thriving democracy like Bharat, a non-partisan forum for state legislatures was long overdue. NLC Bharat fulfilled this need, emerging as a true celebration and reflection of Bharat's vibrant democracy and one of its greatest strengths—its elected representatives.

Overview of the National Conference of State Legislatures

The National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), established by state legislators and legislative staff in 1975, serves all 50 American states, commonwealths, territories, and the District of Columbia. Every state legislator and staff member are a part of this organization enjoying full access to cutting-edge bipartisan policy research, specialized training resources, and tailored technical assistance. NCSL also provides a range of opportunities for members to connect and collaborate with the NCSL Legislative Summit being its flagship event.

NCSL's impact reaches beyond state boundaries, acting as a key advocate for state legislatures in their engagements with the federal government. The organization champions state sovereignty and flexibility, shielding states from unfunded federal mandates and undue federal pre-emption. Additionally, NCSL fosters international collaboration by connecting U.S. state legislatures with their counterparts around the globe, thereby encouraging a cross-border exchange of legislative practices and insights.



NLC Bharat & NCSL: A Continued Engagement

In June 2023, a 10-member NCSL delegation joined the inaugural NLC Bharat Conference in Mumbai, marking a milestone in collaboration. The engagement

translated into a Memorandum of Understanding on 17th May, 2025 marking the beginning of structured cooperation between the two organizations.

The NCSL Legislative Summit is a premier annual event organized by the National Conference of State Legislatures, recognized as one of the largest and most influential gatherings of state legislators, legislative staff, and policymakers in the United States. This year, the summit took place in Boston, Massachusetts, from August 4 to 6, 2025. The summit's highlights included Workshops and Sessions offering a rich array of educational opportunities, featuring standout sessions such as "AI Use Inside the Legislature: What's the Latest?" and a debate on "Tariffs, Free Markets and the Future of U.S. Trade Policy," addressing pressing topics like artificial intelligence, international trade, citizenship and voting, healthcare budgets, cybersecurity, and more with actionable insights to support legislative effectiveness and informed governance.

Networking Opportunities fostered meaningful collaboration among legislators and staff from across the globe, with 130 Indian MLAs and MLCs from 24 states and 21 political parties participating—the largest-ever Indian delegation—engaging with more than 7,000 fellow lawmakers to exchange innovative ideas in areas such as digital democracy, cybersecurity, AI in governance, and voter trust. The parallel session "Navigating the Now: Key Trends in Health Policy" brought together a dynamic panel of legislative leaders and policy experts to deliberate on the rapidly evolving health policy priorities shaping the future of care. Part of the Health and Human Services track, the session highlighted the critical role of state legislatures as innovators and first responders in meeting the health and well-being needs of their citizens.

Moderated by Kate Blackman, Vice President of Policy & Research at the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL), the discussion underscored how states are navigating complex policy landscapes influenced by shifting federal priorities, changing demographics, and the growing demand for equitable, affordable, and accessible health care.

Key Themes and State Perspectives:

Speakers reflected on the pressing health challenges that dominate legislative agendas nationwide. Senator Bo Watson (Tennessee) and Speaker Todd Huston (Indiana) spoke to the critical issues of cost containment, rural hospital viability, and strategies to sustain state Medicaid programs. They emphasized how targeted reforms can help manage fiscal pressures while expanding services in underserved communities.

Speaker Joanna McClinton (Pennsylvania) focused on equity, describing legislative efforts to address health disparities exacerbated by the pandemic. Her interventions emphasized maternal and child health, behavioral health support, and community-centered approaches as vital to building stronger, fairer health systems.

From the national perspective, Kelly Hughes, Lauren Kallins, and Samantha Scotti of NCSL provided a broader lens on how state legislatures are responding to emerging policy directions under the new federal administration. Issues such as the future of telehealth, the regulation of prescription drug pricing, behavioral health crises, and long-term care innovation were flagged as urgent areas where federal and state priorities must align.

Policy Priorities for the Future:

The session highlighted several cross-cutting priorities: strengthening the health workforce, ensuring affordability in drug and hospital pricing, integrating behavioral and physical health services, and leveraging technology for greater access. Telehealth was recognized as both a pandemic-era breakthrough and an ongoing policy challenge requiring careful regulation to ensure equity and sustainability.

Takeaway Reflections:

A unifying theme across the discussion was the recognition of states as "laboratories of democracy." By piloting innovative health initiatives, sharing lessons, and scaling best practices, state legislatures continue to shape national conversations on what effective, equitable, and sustainable care looks like in practice.

Ultimately, the session reinforced the value of forums such as those convened by NLC, Bharat-NCSL, which provide the state leaders with the platform to exchange insights, anticipate emerging trends, and jointly craft policy solutions that strengthen health systems for the future.

The parallel session "Revolutionizing the Future: The Impact of Robotics and AI" convened a distinguished panel of technology leaders and policy experts to examine how robotics and artificial intelligence are reshaping the future of work, learning, and innovation. Part of the Science and Technology track, the session underscored the transformative power of responsible technological advancement in driving economic growth, empowering individuals, and reimagining the possibilities of governance and society.

Moderated by Carolyn Kirk, CEO of the Massachusetts Technology Collaboration, the discussion explored how states and industries can collaboratively harness robotics and AI while addressing the challenges of regulation, workforce transition, and ethical considerations. Nicol Turner Lee, Senior Fellow and Director of the Centre for Technology Innovation at the Brookings Institution, emphasized the importance of equity and inclusion in the digital economy, calling for guardrails that ensure fair access and mitigate bias in AI systems. Tye Brady, Chief Technologist at Amazon Robotics, highlighted how automation is revolutionizing supply chains and service delivery, pointing to real-world applications where robotics enhance efficiency while creating new opportunities for human-machine collaboration.

Key Themes and Perspectives:

Speakers reflected on how the integration of robotics and AI is influencing education, employment, and innovation. Discussions centered on preparing the workforce with future-ready skills, balancing productivity gains with job transitions, and embedding ethical frameworks into AI development. The role of public-private partnerships was highlighted as vital for scaling technological solutions while safeguarding societal interests.

Policy Priorities for the Future:

The session underscored the need for proactive legislative engagement in areas such as data privacy, AI governance, workforce reskilling, and the equitable distribution of technological benefits. Investment in

research, support for startups, and regulatory clarity were identified as priorities to promote responsible innovation. The speakers also stressed that robotics and AI should not be seen solely as disruptors but as catalysts for inclusive economic growth, capable of addressing challenges in healthcare, education, logistics, and beyond.

Takeaway Reflections:

A unifying theme across the discussion was the recognition that legislatures must anticipate the pace of technological change and adapt governance frameworks accordingly. By serving as "laboratories of democracy," states can pilot innovative approaches to AI oversight, ethical deployment, and workforce integration. The panel reaffirmed that bipartisan collaboration, evidence-based regulation, and cross-sector learning are indispensable to maximizing the benefits of robotics and AI.

Ultimately, the session highlighted the value of platforms such as those facilitated by NLC Bharat-NCSL, which enable state legislators to exchange insights, share strategies, and co-create policy pathways that ensure technology serves society's broader goals.

The parallel session "The Road out of the Red: Smart Strategies for Transportation Infrastructure" brought together policymakers and experts to discuss innovative approaches for sustaining and modernizing critical transportation systems. Part of the Transportation track, the session focused on the enormous fiscal demands associated with roads, bridges, and transit networks, highlighting the urgent need for smarter planning, investment, and accountability in infrastructure development.

Moderated by Shannon Francis, State Representative from the Kansas Legislature, the discussion addressed how states can create more resilient and financially sustainable infrastructure systems. Christine Cohen, Senate Deputy President Pro Tempore of the Connecticut General Assembly, emphasized the necessity of balancing immediate repair needs with long-term investments to ensure public safety and economic competitiveness. David Draine, Principal Officer at The Pew Charitable Trusts, underscored the importance of data-driven strategies for tracking maintenance backlogs, forecasting costs, and prioritizing projects effectively. Jim Pressel, State Representative from the Indiana General Assembly, shared legislative strategies for aligning revenue streams with infrastructure demands, stressing the value of bipartisan collaboration in securing stable funding sources.

Key Themes and Perspectives:

The session highlighted how outdated funding models and deferred maintenance can strain state budgets and jeopardize economic growth. Speakers noted that integrating advanced tools for asset management, adopting performance-based budgeting, and leveraging public-private partnerships are essential for ensuring fiscal responsibility. The conversation also focused on the growing need to incorporate sustainability and climate resilience into infrastructure planning, ensuring that investments made today withstand tomorrow's challenges.



Policy Priorities for the Future:

Legislative priorities discussed included the development of innovative financing mechanisms, enhanced federal-state coordination, and the establishment of transparent metrics to track progress. States were encouraged to adopt forward-looking policies that link infrastructure planning with broader economic, environmental, and community goals. Smart investments in multimodal transportation, green infrastructure, and technology-driven solutions such as smart sensors and predictive maintenance were identified as strategies to extend asset life and reduce costs.

Takeaway Reflections:

A recurring theme was that transportation infrastructure is not merely financial liability but a foundational driver of economic vitality and community well-being. By embracing data, promoting collaboration, and prioritizing sustainable investments, state legislatures can transform infrastructure from a recurring fiscal burden into a long-term strategic asset. The panel affirmed that platforms like the NLC Bharat-NCSL Summit are invaluable for state legislators to exchange best practices, learn innovative financing models, and collectively shape policies that keep transportation systems safe, efficient, and future-ready.

The parallel session "A Capitol Conversation: Preserving a Legislative Legacy" offered a deep dive into the historical, architectural, and cultural significance of state capitol buildings while exploring the ongoing challenges of preservation, renovation, and renewal. Part of the Legislative Institution and Legislative Staff Professional Development track, and featured as a Livestream Session, the discussion highlighted how these iconic structures represent more than just seats of government—they embody the democratic ideals, identity, and heritage of each state.

The conversation underscored how state capitols serve not only as workplaces for lawmakers and legislative staff but also as living monuments, public museums, and symbols of continuity in American democracy.

Key Themes and Perspectives:

Andrea Aggert, Director of the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for the State of Illinois, spoke about the complexities of maintaining and renovating historic capitol structures. She emphasized the balance between preserving architectural integrity and ensuring modern functionality. Issues such as accessibility, seismic safety, energy efficiency, and evolving technology were discussed as essential to keeping capitals relevant and usable while respecting their historical character. Her reflections highlighted the importance of planning for the long-term sustainability of these treasured spaces.

Karl Kurtz, political scientist and longtime legislative observer at NCSL, provided a rich historical perspective on the role of capitol buildings in shaping civic identity. He described how state capitals are designed not only to inspire awe but to serve as a tangible expression of democracy in action. By sitting legislatures in visually commanding and symbolically charged spaces, these buildings reinforce the connection between citizens and their representatives. Kurtz also stressed how photographic documentation, like that showcased in Capitol Views, helps preserve memories of these structures for future generations.

Timothy G. Sekerak, Chief Clerk of the Oregon

Legislative Assembly, brought an institutional lens to the discussion. He spoke to the lived experiences of staff and lawmakers working in capitol buildings, noting how these spaces foster traditions, rituals, and a sense of continuity in legislative practice. He also discussed the challenges legislatures face when historic buildings must adapt to changing security demands, workforce needs, and public expectations for openness and accessibility. His remarks reminded the audience that preservation is not only about bricks and mortar but also about maintaining the living traditions embedded within these walls.

Policy Priorities and Preservation Challenges:

The panelists agreed that state legislature must prioritize investments in capitol maintenance and restoration as a core responsibility of democratic stewardship. Funding constraints, political considerations, and competing priorities often make this difficult, yet the cost of neglect is far higher in the long run. The session called for innovative financing, bipartisan commitment, and public engagement to safeguard these structures. Accessibility upgrades, climate resilience measures, and technology integration were highlighted as immediate priorities for the future.

Takeaway Reflections:

The unifying theme of the session was that state capitol buildings are more than architectural marvels; they are enduring symbols of democracy and repositories of collective memory. Preserving them requires a delicate balance of respect for history and openness to innovation. By showcasing the yearslong photographic journey behind Capitol Views, the session reminded participants of the power of visual storytelling in connecting people to the legislative legacy of their states. Ultimately, the conversation underscored the value of forums such as NCSL and NLC Bharat–NCSL partnerships, which bring together policymakers, staff, and experts to reflect on the meaning of legislative institutions and the responsibility of safeguarding them for generations to come.

Parallel Session 5: How to Have Hard Conversations?

The parallel session "How to Have Hard Conversations?" addressed one of the most pressing challenges in today's professional and personal life: how to engage in meaningful dialogue when disagreement, conflict, or polarization stands in the way. Part of the Professional Development track, the session focused on equipping participants with practical tools to navigate difficult conversations at work, in legislative environments, and within communities.

Context and Relevance:

In today's polarized climate, the art of dialogue has become increasingly strained. From legislative chambers where partisan divisions dominate, to workplaces where power dynamics can stifle openness, and even in neighborhoods where social issues spark disagreement, the need for constructive engagement has never been greater. Andrews emphasized that avoiding tough conversations often compounds problems, whereas learning how to engage effectively can transform conflict into collaboration.

Three Tools for Effective Communication:

The session revolved around three practical tools designed to help participants reframe and manage difficult interactions.

1. Active Listening with Empathy: Andrews stressed the importance of listening not just for words but for intent and emotion. She explained how demonstrating empathy can defuse defensiveness and create space for mutual respect. Examples from legislative workplaces highlighted how active listening can ease tensions during policy debates or staff discussions.

2. Framing with Clarity and Respect: The second tool emphasizes clarity in expressing one's perspective without assigning blame or escalating conflict. Andrews provided frameworks for structuring conversations that focus on issues rather than personalities. This technique proved particularly useful for legislative leaders and staff who often need to address sensitive performance or policy disagreements.

3. Finding Common Ground: The third tool focused on seeking shared values or goals as an anchor point, even amidst disagreement. Andrews demonstrated how identifying common ground—such as commitment to public service, organizational mission, or community well-being—can reorient conversations toward collaboration rather than confrontation.

Practical Applications:

The session was highly interactive, with role-playing exercises and scenario-based discussions. Participants engaged in practicing these tools with simulated conversations that mirrored real-world tensions: addressing performance issues with a colleague, managing disagreement with a supervisor, and bridging divides with community members. These practical exercises reinforced the notion that preparation and intentional communication strategies can make hard conversations less daunting.

Leadership and Institutional Impact:

Andrews highlighted the implications of these skills for legislative institutions. Lawmakers and staff who can model respectful, constructive dialogue contribute to a healthier workplace culture and more effective policymaking. In environments where polarization threatens progress, the ability to engage across divides becomes a leadership imperative.

Takeaway Reflections:

The unifying message of the session was that hard conversations are inevitable, but they need not be destructive. With the right tools, they can become opportunities for growth, connection, and problem-solving. Participants left with a practical toolkit for reframing conflict as dialogue, grounded in empathy, clarity, and collaboration.

Ultimately, the session underscored the critical role of communication in sustaining relationships—whether between colleagues, leaders and staff, or neighbors in a community.

The session "Walking the Tightrope: AI's Risks and Rewards" explored one of the most significant technological and policy challenges of our era—the rapid rise of artificial intelligence and its far-reaching implications. Part of the Technology and Communications track with a focus on Artificial Intelligence, this session brought together legislative leaders from across the United States to examine how AI can be harnessed for innovation while addressing its complex risks.

Context and Importance:

Artificial intelligence is no longer confined to the realm of science fiction; it is already reshaping economies, workplaces, and public institutions. From business processes and educational platforms to healthcare systems and government services, AI technologies are rapidly being integrated into daily life. Yet, this transformation raises urgent questions of regulation, ethics, security, and equity. Legislators are increasingly tasked with crafting policies that both encourage innovation and protect citizens from unintended harm.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Opportunities for Innovation: Panelists highlighted the transformative potential of AI in streamlining government operations, reducing inefficiencies, and enhancing constituent services. From predictive analytics for budgeting to AI-powered tools in healthcare and education, lawmakers underscored how AI can help governments respond more effectively to citizens' needs.

2. Risks and Ethical Concerns: Equally important was the discussion of risks. The panel acknowledged pressing challenges such as data privacy, algorithmic bias, cybersecurity threats, and the displacement of jobs. Legislators emphasized that while AI promises efficiency, it also introduces vulnerabilities that must be managed responsibly. Ensuring that AI tools are transparent, accountable, and equitable emerged as a critical concern.

3. Regulatory Balancing Act: The heart of the session centered on the delicate task of balancing regulation with innovation. Speakers agreed that overregulation could stifle technological progress, while under regulation risks harm to individuals and institutions. State legislature, therefore, plays a crucial role in experimenting with frameworks that provide guardrails without curbing creativity and investment.

4. Workforce and Public Trust: Another important dimension discussed was the impact on the workforce. Legislators spoke about the need for reskilling initiatives and educational reforms to prepare workers for jobs in an AI-driven economy. Building public trust through transparency, accountability, and ethical standards was identified as key to AI's long-term integration.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session concluded with a clear message: AI represents both unprecedented opportunities and significant risks, and navigating this "tightrope" will require thoughtful, collaborative policymaking. Legislators must remain proactive, engaging with industry, academia, and civil society to ensure that AI develops in ways that enhance public good.

Participants left with a deeper understanding of the dual nature of AI—as a tool for progress and a challenge demanding vigilance. The voices of the panelists highlighted that the role of state legislature is not merely to react to technological change, but to actively shape the ethical and regulatory frameworks that will govern AI's future.

By promoting dialogue and innovation, while keeping citizens' rights and trust at the center, lawmakers can ensure that AI truly serves society, rather than overwhelming it. The session reinforced that striking this balance is not just a legislative responsibility, but a societal imperative.

The session "AI Use Inside the Legislature: What's the Latest?" focused on the evolving role of artificial intelligence within legislative institutions. As generative AI tools transition from experimental technologies to everyday utilities, legislatures are beginning to establish frameworks that guide their use in policymaking, administration, and constituent engagement. This session, part of the Legislative Institution tracks under Results-Driven Governing with a focus on Artificial Intelligence, provided practical insights into how states are leveraging AI while simultaneously ensuring responsible use.

Context and Importance:

Generative AI has rapidly emerged as a transformative tool for data analysis, drafting support, and constituent communication. Within the legislative setting, however, its integration must be carefully managed due to heightened concerns about accuracy, confidentiality, ethical implications, and public trust. Legislatures are under growing pressure to strike a balance—harnessing the efficiencies of AI without compromising transparency, accountability, or democratic integrity.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Practical Applications of AI in Legislative Work: Panelists discussed the growing use of AI to improve efficiency in drafting bills, analyzing policy proposals, managing records, and supporting constituent services. Routine but time-intensive tasks—such as summarizing reports or organizing legislative documents—are being streamlined, allowing staff to focus on higher-level policy work.

2. Guardrails and Ethical Use: The conversation emphasized that effective guardrails are essential. Legislatures are developing policies that restrict reliance on AI for tasks requiring legal precision or political sensitivity. For instance, AI tools may assist in drafting or research, but final decisions remain firm with staff and elected officials. Ethical concerns such as data protection, misinformation, and accountability were highlighted as top priorities.

3. Institutional Challenges: Panelists acknowledged the challenges of integrating AI into legislative settings. These include managing security risks, ensuring accuracy in outputs, and preventing over-dependence on automated tools. Training and guidance for staff were cited as critical steps in ensuring AI use enhances rather than undermines institutional integrity.

4. Cross-State Collaboration: Speakers also pointed to the value of collaboration across legislatures. Organizations like NCSL play a pivotal role in sharing best practices, facilitating dialogue, and helping states learn from one another's experiences in adopting and regulating AI tools.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session underscored that the question is no longer whether legislatures will use AI, but how they will govern its use responsibly. The panelists agreed that AI should be seen as a supportive tool, not a replacement for human judgment. By creating clear policies, providing staff training, and sharing lessons across states, legislatures can ensure AI is integrated in ways that strengthen—rather than weaken—the democratic process.

Participants left with a clearer picture of how legislative bodies are managing the rapid adoption of generative AI, and why proactive governance is essential. The session affirmed that thoughtful implementation and consistent oversight are the keys to making AI an asset in legislative institutions.

Parallel Session 8: *Self-Care: Mission Critical*

The session "Self-Care: Mission Critical" brought attention to an often overlooked yet essential aspect of legislative life: personal well-being. While the responsibilities of legislators and their staff revolve around serving the public, shaping policies, and responding to the demands of constituents, the intense workload can often lead to exhaustion, stress, and burnout. This professional development session highlighted why self-care is not a luxury but a necessity for sustaining productivity, effectiveness, and personal fulfillment in the legislative environment.

Context and Importance:

Legislative work is uniquely demanding. From long hours during session and committee hearings to the constant weight of public expectations, policymakers and staff frequently put others' needs before their own. However, without maintaining their own health—both physical and mental—their ability to serve meaningfully diminishes. This session reframed self-care as a mission-critical practice, not merely a personal indulgence, but as a professional responsibility that directly impacts institutional effectiveness.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Hidden Costs of Neglecting Self-Care: Quiner explained that burnout, stress-related illnesses, and diminished concentration are common consequences of ignoring one's well-being. These challenges not only affect the individual but also reduce team efficiency and legislative outcomes. A healthy, resilient legislator or staff member, by contrast, is better equipped to make sound decisions and maintain positive relationships.

2. Practical Strategies for Stress Management: The session explored evidence-based strategies to address stress. Techniques such as mindfulness, short exercise routines during breaks, setting boundaries with work, and ensuring adequate rest were emphasized. Importantly, these practices were framed not as time-consuming commitments but as small, sustainable habits that can be integrated into the busiest schedules.

3. Balancing Professional Demands with Personal Health: Quiner encouraged participants to view self-care as part of their professional duty. By prioritizing mental clarity, physical energy, and emotional stability, legislators and staff can perform their roles with greater focus and resilience. A culture of well-being within legislatures, he noted, sets a powerful example for communities.

4. Changing the Narrative Around Self-Care: One of the most impactful discussions centered on shifting the perception of self-care from being self-centered to being mission-driven. By acknowledging that neglecting personal health compromises their service to others, participants were encouraged to see self-care as an investment in their capacity to lead and govern effectively.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session reinforced that self-care is not optional—it is foundational. Legislators and staff who practice consistent self-care are more effective leaders, collaborators, and public servants. Participants walked away with practical tools and a renewed perspective: caring for oneself is not at odds with public service but essential to it.

Ultimately, "Self-Care: Mission Critical" reminded attendees that the health of legislative institutions begins with the health of the individuals who serve within them. By embedding self-care into the culture of legislative work, the risk of burnout can be reduced, and the sustainability of leadership enhanced.

The session "When Science Met Policy: A Fabulous Fellowship" highlighted how science policy fellowships have emerged as a vital bridge between the scientific community and state legislatures. In an age where policymaking is increasingly influenced by technological advancement, climate change, and public health challenges, the need for credible, accessible, and timely scientific expertise is greater than ever. Fellowships serve as win-win: lawmakers gain reliable access to technical knowledge, and fellows acquire hands-on experience in shaping public policy.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Power of Expertise in Policymaking: Legislators emphasized how science policy fellows help translate complex research into actionable insights. Roger Hanshaw noted that fellows are particularly valuable in emerging areas such as environmental regulation and biotechnology, where decisions often have long-term implications. Isabel Warner reflected on how fellows not only provide expertise but also help legislators ask better, sharper questions, ultimately leading to stronger policymaking.

2. Mutual Benefits of Fellowships: The conversation underscored the dual advantages of fellowships. For legislators, they provide clarity amid competing data sources and public pressures. For fellows, they offer an immersive learning experience into the dynamics of governance. Kristan Uhlenbrock explained that these programs create a "two-way learning environment"—scientists learn the language of policy, and policymakers gain a deeper appreciation of evidence-based approaches.

3. Building Trust Between Science and Politics: Trust emerged as a recurring theme. James Maroney highlighted that having nonpartisan fellows embedded within legislative processes promote trust and depoliticize technical debates. When lawmakers can rely on fellows to present evidence neutrally, it reduces polarization and helps ensure decisions are guided more by facts than partisanship.

4. Case Studies of Impact: Speakers shared concrete examples of how fellowships had shaped policy outcomes. From drafting legislation on renewable energy to providing background on healthcare innovations, fellows have helped close the knowledge gap. Warner cited instances where her research synthesis allowed legislators to navigate contentious issues more confidently, while Hanshaw stressed that fellows often act as catalysts, enabling legislatures to move from debate to action more efficiently.

5. Scaling and Institutionalizing Fellowships: A critical part of the discussion was about sustainability. Uhlenbrock and Bhullar both pointed to the need for expanding fellowship opportunities across more states and embedding them within legislative institutions. Doing so would ensure that science-informed policymaking becomes a consistent, systemic practice rather than an occasional advantage.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session reinforced that science policy fellowships are not just temporary arrangements, they are strategic investments in governance. By enabling legislators to ground decisions in evidence and providing scientists with insight into the policymaking process, fellowships enrich both domains. Speakers collectively emphasized that the ultimate beneficiaries are the citizens, who gain from policies that are informed, practical, and forward-looking.

In sum, "When Science Met Policy: A Fabulous Fellowship" demonstrated that bridging science and policy is no longer optional. These fellowship models illustrate how legislatures can build resilience, adaptability, and credibility in addressing the challenges of the 21st century.

Immersion Visits

Massachusetts State House

The Massachusetts State Capitol Building, located in Boston, serves as the seat of government for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Designed by architect Charles Bulfinch and completed in 1798, the Federal-style structure is distinguished by its gleaming golden dome, a prominent landmark overlooking the Boston Common. The building's red brick façade and classical detailing reflect the elegance of early American architecture. Inside, the Capitol houses the offices of the Governor and the chambers of the Massachusetts General Court, comprising the Senate and House of Representatives. The interior features historic paintings, intricate woodwork, and marble accents that narrate the state's rich political and cultural heritage. Notable highlights include the Doric Hall, adorned with statues and portraits of notable figures, and the Senate Chamber, with its ornate décor and symbolic motifs. Surrounding the Capitol are well-maintained grounds that provide a stately setting for this enduring symbol of Massachusetts' democratic governance. The visit of Bharat's lawmakers to this historic landmark offered them valuable insights into the state's legislative traditions and architectural splendour.





The session "Higher Ed: A Value Proposition" explored one of the most pressing questions in education policy today: how do lawmakers, educators, and institutions define and measure the worth of a college degree? In an era when students face rising tuition costs, shifting labor market demands, and debates about equity and access, the value of higher education is under increased scrutiny. The discussion sought to clarify what makes a degree valuable, how that value can be measured, and how policymakers can design supportive frameworks to ensure degrees lead to meaningful outcomes.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Defining the Value of a Degree: Panelists agreed that the value of higher education cannot be reduced solely to earnings after graduation. K.L. Allen stressed that while employment and wage gains remain important, the true measure of value should also include personal growth, critical thinking, civic engagement, and lifelong learning. Sarah Willie-LeBreton added that higher education contributes to a stronger democracy by preparing students to be informed, engaged citizens.

2. Measuring Outcomes Beyond the Economic Lens: Noe Ortega raised concerns about an over-reliance on narrow economic metrics to evaluate higher education outcomes. He pointed to the importance of measuring access, equity, and completion rates, particularly for students from underrepresented backgrounds. Timothy Knowles echoed this by noting that the long-term societal benefits of higher education—such as lower incarceration rates, better health outcomes, and civic participation—should be part of the value equation.

3. Policymakers' Role in Ensuring Degrees of Value: Speakers emphasized the critical role lawmakers play in shaping funding models, accountability systems, and regulatory frameworks. Allen noted that flexible pathways and competency-based education models allow students to align degrees with workforce needs, while also recognizing prior learning. Ortega emphasized that state-level policies must focus on affordability and completion, ensuring that financial aid programs and support systems target students who

are at the highest risk of dropping out.

4. The Debate on Accountability and Transparency: Transparency in higher education was a recurring theme. Willie-LeBreton observed that students and families often struggle to navigate the vast amount of information about cost, quality, and outcomes. Legislators were urged to support efforts that make institutional data more accessible and comparable. Knowles added that accountability measures must be carefully designed to avoid penalizing institutions that serve higher proportions of first-generation and low-income students.

5. Looking Forward: Redefining Value in a Changing Landscape: As higher education adapts to technological disruption, workforce evolution, and demographic shifts, the session concluded with a call to redefine value in a broader, more inclusive way. Speakers agreed that the future of higher education depends on balancing the economic benefits with the civic, social, and cultural dimensions of a degree. Griffin summarized that effective policymaking would require both rigorous measurement and recognition of the intangible contributions higher education provides to society.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session highlighted that while economic returns matter, the value of higher education must be framed more comprehensively. Legislators were encouraged to adopt policies that reflect both quantitative outcomes—such as employment and completion rates—and qualitative benefits like civic responsibility, equity, and personal development.

Ultimately, degrees of value are those that equip students not only for jobs but also for lives of purpose, participation, and resilience in a rapidly changing world.

The session "Universal Broadband Access: The Path Forward" examined the progress, challenges, and opportunities in achieving universal connectivity. Historic state and federal investments have accelerated efforts to bring high-speed broadband to underserved communities yet sustaining these networks and ensuring equitable digital participation remain complex tasks. The panel addressed the dual goals of building robust infrastructure and empowering households with the tools, skills, and devices to thrive in today's digital-first society.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Historic Investments and Current Progress: Andrew Butcher opened by reflecting on the unprecedented level of federal and state funding dedicated to broadband expansion, particularly through initiatives such as the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program. He emphasized that states have made remarkable strides in mapping unserved areas, allocating resources, and partnering with local providers. Yet, he cautioned that funding alone will not solve connectivity gaps—long-term planning and local collaboration are vital.

2. Bridging Rural and Urban Divides: Cindy Ryu underscored that while broadband deserts are often associated with rural parts, urban areas also face affordability and adoption challenges. She highlighted state-level programs that subsidize internet costs for low-income families and ensure community anchor institutions, such as libraries and schools, serve as digital hubs. Daniel Linville expanded on this by pointing to Appalachian communities, where rugged geography poses significant infrastructure hurdles. He stressed that fiber deployment, wireless solutions, and innovative technologies must work together to overcome these barriers.

3. Sustainability and Maintenance of Networks: A recurring concern was the sustainability of broadband infrastructure once the initial buildout is complete. Janie Dunning drew on her USDA experience to argue that maintenance plans, operational funding, and workforce development must accompany

infrastructure investment. Without attention to upkeep, she warned, networks risk falling into disrepair, undoing years of progress.

4. Digital Skills and Device Access: The panel agreed that universal broadband is not just about availability, it also requires adoption. Ryu emphasized the importance of digital literacy programs for seniors, students, and workers transitioning into digital economies. Butcher added that device access, particularly affordable laptops and tablets, is equally essential, since connectivity without hardware leaves households digitally excluded. Linville noted that partnerships with community colleges and nonprofits have shown promise in bridging digital skills gaps.

5. The Role of Policymakers and Local Communities: Speakers highlighted that policymakers play a central role in ensuring accountability, equity, and inclusiveness in broadband rollout. They called for policies that prioritize underserved populations and involve community voices in decision-making. Dunning stressed the importance of empowering local leaders to tailor solutions to their unique regional contexts.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The discussion underscored that achieving universal broadband access is within reach, but success requires a holistic approach. Infrastructure investments must be matched with strategies for sustainability, affordability, and digital readiness. Legislators and policymakers were urged to view broadband as essential infrastructure—akin to water, electricity, or roads—while also addressing the human side of digital inclusion.

The session concluded with a call to ensure that every household, regardless of geography or income, not only has access to broadband but also the capacity to harness its full potential for education, employment, healthcare, and civic participation.




Immersion Visits TD Garden

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Parallel Session 12: *Unretirement: Rethinking work in the age of longevity*

The session "Unretirement: Rethinking Work in the Age of Longevity" explored the growing phenomenon of older peoples returning to the workforce after retirement, a trend reshaping the labor market and presenting both challenges and opportunities for policymakers, employers, and retirees. With increased life expectancy, changing economic realities, and evolving personal aspirations, retirement is no longer viewed as a permanent exit from employment. The panel engaged in a thoughtful discussion on what drives this "unretirement" movement and how states can support older workers in ways that strengthen the economy and foster inclusion.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Rise of Unretirement: Moderator Angela Rowe framed the discussion by highlighting demographic trends: longer life expectancy, improved health in later years, and a generation of retirees who remain motivated to stay engaged in meaningful work. Carly Roszkowski noted that many older adults return to work out of necessity, driven by inflation, rising health care costs, or insufficient retirement savings. However, she emphasized that equally important are those who return for purpose, social connection, and the chance to apply their experience in new ways.

2. Economic Impact and Workforce Gaps: Representative Llew Jones connected unretirement to broader labor market dynamics. With many industries facing worker shortages, particularly in health care, education, and skilled trades—older workers can provide critical expertise and stability. He stressed that their participation helps mitigate workforce shortages while boosting state economies. Roszkowski added that employers benefit from intergenerational collaboration, as experienced workers bring mentorship value, reliability, and institutional knowledge.

3. Policy Approaches to Support Older Workers: The panel agreed that states must play an active role in making the workplace age inclusive. This includes reviewing retirement and pension policies to remove disincentives for employment, expanding access to job

retraining programs, and promoting flexible work arrangements. Roszkowski highlighted AARP initiatives that advocate for policies preventing age discrimination and encouraging employers to adopt age-friendly practices. Jones shared examples from Montana, where workforce development programs are being adapted to welcome retirees back into productive roles.

4. Health, Flexibility, and Work-Life Balance: A recurring theme was the need to adapt workplace structures to the realities of older workers. Flexibility in scheduling, remote work options, and part-time opportunities were cited as critical factors in sustaining unretirement trends. Roszkowski stressed that health benefits and ergonomic workplace design are equally important in enabling older employees to remain active and productive.

5. Changing Perceptions of Retirement: The session emphasized that retirement is no longer a single endpoint but part of a continuum of work and life choices. Roszkowski argued that shifting cultural perceptions around aging and work is essential. Employers, she said, must move beyond stereotypes that undervalue older workers. Rowe concluded that redefining retirement as a flexible, evolving stage of life benefits both individuals and society at large.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The panel concluded that unretirement is more than an economic trend—it is a social and cultural shift. It offers retirees the chance to remain purposeful while helping states and industries address labor shortages. Policymakers were encouraged to craft strategies that integrate older workers into the economy through flexible employment, supportive benefits, and anti-discrimination measures.

Ultimately, the rise of unretirement illustrates how longer lives can be turned into longer contributions, with mutual benefits for individuals, employers, and the nation's economic vitality.

This session, "What Works to Keep Youth Out of Trouble," examined strategies and interventions designed to prevent young people from entering the criminal justice system. With youth crime prevention becoming an increasingly critical issue across states, the discussion brought together policymakers, practitioners, and advocates to explore evidence-based solutions that not only enhance public safety but also foster accountability, personal growth, and productive futures for young people. The session emphasized that prevention is more cost-effective and socially beneficial than punishment and highlighted bipartisan cooperation and innovative community efforts in reducing youth involvement in crime.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Importance of Prevention Over Punishment:

Moderator Anne Teigen framed the conversation by underscoring the effectiveness of early interventions in steering young people away from criminal behavior. Senator Brandon Storm emphasized that punitive approaches alone are insufficient; instead, investments in prevention programs—such as mentoring, family engagement, and school-based interventions—have shown measurable success. He argued that preventing crime at the root causes not only saves lives but also conserves state resources.

2. Community-Based Solutions: Donnell Drinks drew from his extensive advocacy experience, stressing the need to ground prevention efforts in community engagement and leadership. He explained how programs focusing on restorative justice, peer mentorship, and opportunities for youth empowerment can break cycles of crime. His perspective highlighted the value of lived experience, noting that formerly incarcerated individuals often play a vital role in helping young people see alternatives to crime.

3. Legislative and Policy Initiatives: Delegate J. Sandy Bartlett presented legislative strategies aimed at addressing systemic issues that contribute to youth delinquency. She discussed reforms to juvenile justice policies in Maryland that prioritize rehabilitation, diversion programs, and holistic services over incarceration. Bartlett emphasized that bipartisan

consensus is emerging around these approaches because they demonstrably improve long-term outcomes for both youth and communities.

4. Evidence-Based Interventions and Research: Logan Seacrest contributed insights from research and policy analysis, particularly on data-driven interventions that reduce recidivism. He emphasized that programs like cognitive behavioral therapy, vocational training, and family-based treatment models are backed by empirical evidence. Seacrest also highlighted the importance of accountability and results-driven governing, noting that policymakers must track outcomes to ensure public investments are effective and scalable.

5. Bipartisan Commitment to Youth Development: A recurring theme throughout the session was the importance of bipartisan cooperation in advancing reforms. Senator Storm and Delegate Bartlett both reflected on how lawmakers from different political backgrounds can come together around shared values of public safety and youth opportunity. The panel noted that framing youth crime prevention as both a social good and an economic necessity has helped bridge partisan divides.


Takeaways and Reflections:

The session concluded with a strong consensus that keeping youth out of trouble requires a multifaceted, collaborative approach. Prevention must begin early, be sustained through adolescence, and involve schools, families, community leaders, and policymakers. Investments in evidence-based programs, restorative justice, and workforce development not only reduce crime but also create pathways for youth to become accountable, resilient, and productive adults. By prioritizing prevention, states can enhance public safety, reduce costs associated with incarceration, and foster stronger communities. Ultimately, the panel underscored that what works to keep youth out of trouble is not just tougher laws but smarter, compassionate, and result-driven strategies that give every young person the opportunity to succeed.



Change has always been a defining feature of human survival and growth. From adapting to life at extreme altitudes and underwater to achieving milestones in outer space, human beings have demonstrated a remarkable capacity for resilience. Yet, when it comes to organizational changes, especially in government and state institutions, the process often meets resistance. "The Challenge of Change" explored why it is easier for humans to adjust to environmental extremes than to shift the deeply ingrained patterns of institutions, workplaces, and bureaucracies.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Psychology of Resistance: Shankar Vedantam opened the session by discussing why human beings, despite their history of adaptation, struggle with organizational change. Drawing from behavioral science, he explained how unconscious biases and habitual thinking act as invisible anchors, pulling individuals and institutions back toward the status quo. People perceive change as risky, uncertain, and often threatening to their identity or position, which makes institutions particularly slow to evolve.

2. Hidden Brain Insights: Using research and stories from his acclaimed Hidden Brain podcast, Vedantam illustrated how leaders often underestimate the psychological weight of routine and tradition. He noted that leaders typically approach change through logic, data, and planning, but fail to account for the subconscious fears and emotional responses of their teams. For example, even well-designed reforms may falter if they ignore the "hidden brain" that drives human behavior more powerfully than rational decision-making.

3. The Role of Leadership in Change Management: Senator Barry Usher brought the perspective of legislative leadership, reflecting on how state governments grapple with modernization and reform. He emphasized that while laws can mandate new systems, it is the culture of public institutions that determines whether these reforms succeed. Usher shared experiences from Montana's legislature where bipartisan cooperation, clear communication, and

gradual implementation proved essential to building trust and reducing resistance to change.

4. Avoiding Common Mistakes: Both speakers highlighted frequent mistakes leaders make during periods of transformation. Vedantam stressed that overemphasis on technical solutions—like adopting new technologies—without addressing human psychology is a recipe for failure. Usher added that leaders sometimes move too quickly, alienating stakeholders who feel left behind.

5. Strategies for Effective Transformation: The panel offered practical strategies for navigating change:

- Leaders must frame change not as a loss, but as an opportunity for growth and empowerment.
- Storytelling and emotional connection are as important as policy details.
- Change must involve participation, where stakeholders feel ownership rather than compliance.
- Leaders must model adaptability themselves, demonstrating openness to feedback and course corrections.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session underscored that while humans can adapt to some of the harshest environments on Earth and beyond, institutional change poses unique challenges rooted in psychology, tradition, and social dynamics. By recognizing unconscious biases, engaging stakeholders, and framing change as opportunity rather than disruption, leaders can overcome resistance.

The discussion by Shankar Vedantam and Barry Usher illuminated a critical truth: the success of organizational transformation depends less on the brilliance of a plan and more on the ability to understand and work with the human brain's hidden tendencies. For lawmakers and public leaders, mastering this dimension of change is key to creating resilient, forward-looking institutions capable of meeting tomorrow's challenges.

Parallel Session 15: *Getting Unstuck: Options When Your Professional Path Feels Stalled*

In today's dynamic professional environment, many individuals encounter periods where their career trajectory feels stalled. Despite hard work, dedication, and expertise, progress may seem elusive, leaving professionals uncertain about their direction. "Getting Unstuck: Options When Your Professional Path Feels Stalled" addressed this critical issue, offering actionable strategies to regain momentum, rediscover motivation, and realign career goals.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Understanding Professional Stagnation: McAllister began by normalizing the experience of feeling "stuck." She highlighted how professional stagnation can arise from various sources: limited advancement opportunities, burnout, routine-driven work, or unrecognized contributions. Importantly, she emphasized that such moments are not signs of failure but opportunities to pause, reflect, and strategically reorient one's path.

2. The Role of Thoughts and Feelings in Career Progression: Drawing on coaching principles, McAllister explored how internal narratives and emotions significantly influence professional outcomes. Negative self-talk, fear of failure, or a fixed mindset can unconsciously restrict opportunities. Conversely, cultivating awareness of these mental patterns can unlock new energy and perspectives. She urged participants to reflect on the interplay between thoughts, feelings, and actions, recognizing that transformation often begins internally before it is visible externally.

3. Five Practical Options for Getting Unstuck: At the heart of the session was McAllister's framework of five universal options always available to professionals facing a plateau:

- **Shift Perspective:** Reframe challenges as growth opportunities, changing how you perceive your current role.
- **Seek Development:** Pursue training, certifications, or skill-building initiatives to expand your expertise.

- **Change Approach:** Modify work habits, communication styles, or problem-solving methods to achieve new results.
- **Expand Networks:** Build relationships within and outside your organization to access fresh insights and opportunities.
- **Redefine Goals:** Realign personal and professional aspirations, considering whether current objectives reflect your true ambitions.

4. Overcoming Emotional Barriers: McAllister noted that fear, self-doubt, and external comparisons are major barriers to growth. Through real-life anecdotes and interactive discussion, she demonstrated how shifting from self-criticism to self-compassion enables professionals to take calculated risks.

5. Creating Sustainable Progress: Beyond immediate solutions, the session stressed the importance of sustainable career growth. McAllister recommended ongoing reflection practices such as journaling, mentorship, and periodic career check-ins to prevent future plateaus. She underscored that the process of "getting unstuck" is not a one-time fix but a lifelong skill of resilience and adaptability.

Takeaways and Reflections:

Participants left with a practical and inspirational toolkit to overcome career stagnation. By understanding the psychological underpinnings of feeling stuck, recognizing the power of thoughts and emotions, and implementing the five options outlined, professionals can transform obstacles into opportunities.

Overall McAllister's session highlighted that career growth rarely involves pauses, pivots, and renewed directions. What matters is the ability to reframe challenges and take proactive steps toward progress. For legislators, staff, and professionals across sectors, "Getting Unstuck" served as a timely reminder: plateaus are not endpoints but turning points. With awareness, courage, and strategy, individuals can rediscover momentum and create meaningful, fulfilling professional journeys.

Modern legislatures face an ever-expanding range of policy challenges, often requiring rapid yet informed decision-making. In an environment where the volume of data can overwhelm and partisan pressures can cloud judgment, access to evidence-based tools becomes indispensable. The session "Notes and Bolts: Great Legislative Decision-Making Tools" brought together experts and practitioners to discuss innovative strategies and practical resources that empower legislators to make effective, timely, and accountable policy decisions.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. The Role of Fiscal Notes in Legislative Decision-Making: Fiscal notes remain one of the most important tools for lawmakers, offering clear assessments of the economic implications of proposed legislation. Erica MacKellar emphasized how fiscal notes provide not only cost projections but also insights into long-term sustainability. When used effectively, they become more than budgetary annotations—they serve as a safeguard against unintended consequences and ensure that public resources are allocated responsibly.

2. Evidence Ratings as a Guide to Policy Effectiveness: Jon Courtney highlighted how evidence ratings, which evaluate the strength of research backing various policy interventions, allow legislators to separate proven strategies from untested ideas. By adopting a framework like scientific evidence hierarchies, legislatures can prioritize programs that have demonstrated effectiveness while maintaining transparency with the public about the rationale for policy choices.

3. Performance Dashboards for Real-Time Accountability: Kensey Bergdorf-Smith introduced performance dashboards as dynamic tools that provide legislators with up-to-date data on program outcomes and implementation progress. These dashboards enable legislators to monitor government performance in real time, bridging the gap between policymaking and practice. By embedding accountability into decision-making, performance dashboards foster public trust

and allow quick adjustments when outcomes diverge from expectations.

4. Integration of Tools for Holistic Governance: A central insight from the panel was the importance of integrating fiscal notes, evidence ratings, and performance dashboards into a cohesive decision-making system. Carrington Skinner emphasized that when these tools operate in tandem, they not only inform legislative choices but also enhance institutional credibility. For legislators, such integration reduces the risk of reactive policymaking and strengthens long-term governance capacity.

5. Challenges and Opportunities: Speakers acknowledged challenges, such as ensuring data quality, avoiding misuse of technical tools, and addressing political resistance. However, they also pointed to opportunities for innovation, particularly in leveraging partnerships with universities, research institutions, and nonpartisan organizations. Bergdorf-Smith stressed the importance of training legislators and staff to interpret and apply evidence correctly, turning tools into engines of progress rather than bureaucratic hurdles.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session underscored that effective governance requires more than intuition or political expediency—it depends on rigorous, accessible, and timely information. Legislators who embrace fiscal notes, evidence ratings, and performance dashboards can balance speed with substance, ensuring that decisions are both swift and grounded in fact.

Ultimately, "Notes and Bolts" highlighted that these tools are not just technical instruments but democratic safeguards—they promote transparency, accountability, and public trust in legislative institutions. As the pace of governance accelerates, evidence-informed decision-making is no longer optional; it is essential for results-driven governing that meets the complex needs of today's citizens.



Parallel Session 17: *Building Resilience, Feeling Safe: A Guide for Women Legislators*

Public service brings with it both profound opportunities and unique challenges. For women legislators, the journey is often marked by additional pressures, ranging from digital harassment and gendered scrutiny to safety concerns in public spaces. The session "Building Resilience, Feeling Safe: A Guide for Women Legislators" provided a comprehensive exploration of strategies that empower women leaders to safeguard themselves while continuing to lead with confidence and impact. Dr. Aparna Ghosh, an expert in innovation and resilience, guided participants through practical tools and approaches designed to foster both personal safety and professional strength.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Understanding the Landscape of Risk for Women Leaders: Dr. Aparna Ghosh began by framing the current realities faced by women legislators. She explained that gendered threats are not confined to physical spaces—they extend into digital arenas where online harassment, cyberstalking, and targeted misinformation campaigns are prevalent. Recognizing these risks is the first step toward building resilience and creating a secure environment for women in politics.

2. Digital Safety as a Priority: One of the focal points of the discussion was digital security. Dr. Ghosh emphasized the importance of adopting practices such as multi-factor authentication, regular password updates, and the use of encrypted communication platforms. She highlighted the need for legislators and their staff to receive continuous training in cybersecurity, thereby reducing vulnerabilities that adversaries often exploit.

3. Navigating Public and In-Person Spaces Safely: In addition to digital threats, women legislators frequently encounter challenges in physical settings—be it during public rallies, community interactions, or travel. Dr. Ghosh provided practical measures for situational awareness, risk assessment, and emergency preparedness. She encouraged legislators to work with security personnel, leverage local law enforcement

partnerships, and use discreet safety technologies such as mobile alert applications.

4. Resilience as a Leadership Skill: Safety is not only about defense—it is about cultivating resilience. Dr. Ghosh emphasized emotional and psychological resilience as core to thriving in demanding political careers. Strategies such as mindfulness, peer support networks, and structured self-care routines were presented as tools to help women legislators maintain balance, manage stress, and continue their service without burnout.

5. Institutional and Collective Solutions: The session also underscored the importance of systemic change. While individual practices are essential, Dr. Ghosh argued for the development of institutional frameworks that prioritize women's safety. This includes legislative bodies adopting clear anti-harassment policies, creating reporting mechanisms, and investing in security infrastructure tailored to the needs of women leaders.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session affirmed that resilience and safety are not optional; they are prerequisites for effective governance. Women legislators cannot lead fully if they are under constant threat or stress. By integrating digital security practices, strengthening physical safety measures, and embracing resilience-building strategies, women can navigate challenges with greater confidence.

In this way Dr. Aparna Ghosh's message was clear: safety and resilience are empowering tools, not constraints. When women leaders feel secure, they can amplify their voices, expand their influence, and model strength for future generations. "Building Resilience, Feeling Safe" thus served as both a guide and a call to action for creating legislative spaces where women can serve without fear and with lasting impact.

As the United States grapples with balancing economic growth and environmental responsibility, carbon capture has emerged as a critical tool in the clean energy transition. The session "Carbon Capture: What's Next?" brought together experts to analyze the evolving landscape of carbon capture, utilization, and storage (CCUS). The discussion emphasized the technology's commercial readiness, its potential in reducing greenhouse gas emissions, and the policy and market dynamics shaping its deployment. With fossil fuel production continuing to be prioritized in the national energy mix, carbon capture offers a pathway to reconcile energy demands with climate commitments.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Commercial Readiness of Carbon Capture: Patrice Lahlum outlined the growing maturity of CCUS technologies, emphasizing that carbon capture is no longer confined to laboratory research but has entered a phase of commercial deployment. She highlighted successful projects across industrial sectors such as cement, steel, and power generation, where carbon capture has demonstrated viability. With supportive policies and funding mechanisms, these technologies are poised for broader adoption in both energy and industrial ecosystems.

2. Role in Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions: A core theme of the session was the urgent need to reduce emissions while sustaining energy security. Both speakers highlighted how carbon capture can complement renewable energy expansion by addressing emissions from hard-to-abate sectors. Rob Creager stressed that industries such as oil, gas, and heavy manufacturing cannot decarbonize overnight, and CCUS provides a pragmatic bridge to achieving mid-century climate targets.

3. Market Forces and Economic Incentives: Carbon capture's advancement depends significantly on market conditions and incentives. The speakers examined federal tax credits like 45Q, state-level incentives, and private sector investment as key drivers of deployment. They also discussed the importance of creating reliable markets for captured carbon, including its utilization in products such as

synthetic fuels, building materials, and agricultural inputs. By turning carbon from waste into a resource, CCUS technologies can align environmental objectives with economic opportunities.

4. Challenges in Deployment

Despite its promise, carbon capture faces hurdles in scaling up. Infrastructure for transporting and storing carbon dioxide remains limited, and permitting processes can be slow. Both experts called for stronger regulatory frameworks, investment in pipeline networks, and public-private collaboration to address these gaps. Additionally, they acknowledged the importance of building public trust by ensuring transparency, environmental safeguards, and community engagement in CCUS projects.

5. Policy and the Future Outlook

Looking ahead, the panel underscored the role of policy in shaping carbon capture's trajectory. Federal initiatives, bipartisan support, and state-level leadership will be crucial in accelerating adoption. While fossil fuel production continues to hold political significance, integrating carbon capture into energy systems offers a balanced approach that supports economic development, protects jobs, and advances climate goals.

Takeaways and Reflections:


The session reinforced that carbon capture is not a distant innovation but a present-day solution ready for scale. It offers a vital pathway to reconcile the nation's reliance on fossil fuels with its climate commitments. As Patrice Lahlum and Rob Creager emphasized, success depends on strategic investment, supportive policy, and robust infrastructure development.

Ultimately, "Carbon Capture: What's Next?" positioned CCUS as both a technological and political opportunity. If embraced thoughtfully, carbon capture can play a pivotal role in reducing emissions, promoting industrial innovation, and ensuring that the nation remains at the forefront of the global energy transition.

In the realm of politics and governance, leadership is often framed as a finite competition—winning the next election, passing the next bill, or outperforming political opponents. Yet, such a mindset overlooks the broader and enduring responsibilities of public service. The session “Leading in an Infinite Game” redefined leadership for legislators by introducing the concept of the infinite game, where the objective is not to defeat opponents but to sustain progress, strengthen institutions, and deliver long-term impact. With insights grounded in political practice and leadership theory, the session challenged lawmakers to expand their perspectives beyond short-term victories and adopt a mindset that prioritizes resilience, adaptability, and generational change.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Finite vs. Infinite Leadership: Curt Stedron began by distinguishing between finite and infinite games. Finite games, such as elections, are governed by clear rules, timeframes, and measurable outcomes—someone wins, and someone loses. Infinite games, by contrast, have no definitive endpoint. In governance, the “game” is sustaining democracy, protecting institutions, and creating systems that serve the people over generations. Legislators, he emphasized, must resist the temptation to treat leadership as short-term competition and instead recognize their role in advancing the infinite game of democracy.

2. Shaping a Sustainable Vision: One of the central ideas was the importance of vision in infinite leadership. Leaders must craft goals that transcend electoral cycles and remain relevant to future generations. Stedron highlighted the necessity of fostering bipartisan cooperation, preserving institutional credibility, and setting strategic agendas that endure beyond individual terms. This shift requires courage and clarity: courage to make decisions that may not yield immediate rewards and clarity to articulate why such decisions matter for the long-term health of society.

3. Building Resilience and Adaptability: Infinite leadership demands resilience in the face of setbacks

and adaptability to ever-changing contexts. Stedron argued that policymakers must be prepared for challenges without clear solutions—emerging technologies, demographic shifts, or global crises. By cultivating adaptive thinking, leaders can navigate uncertainty while keeping their institutions and constituents at the center of decision-making. This adaptability, he noted, is not about abandoning principles but about applying them in innovative and responsive ways.

4. Collaboration Over Competition: In finite games, opponents are to be defeated. In infinite games, opponents become necessary partners in sustaining the system. Stedron emphasized that lawmakers should embrace collaboration even across ideological divides. By working together to maintain trust in governance and uphold democratic values, legislators ensure that their chamber remains effective and credible. This mindset positions collaboration not as weakness but as a strength essential for navigating long-term challenges.

5. Practical Tools for Infinite Leadership: The session offered actionable tools for adopting an infinite mindset. Stedron encouraged legislators to reflect on their legacy: What systems are they leaving behind? How will future lawmakers build on their contributions? He provided frameworks for self-assessment, strategies for fostering bipartisan dialogue, and examples of chambers that successfully balanced immediate pressures with long-term stability.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session highlighted that effective legislative leadership cannot be confined to the win-or-lose logic of finite games. Instead, it requires an infinite perspective that prioritizes institutional longevity, collaboration, and adaptability. Curt Stedron’s message was clear: legislators who embrace an infinite mindset position their chambers not just for immediate victories but for enduring success.

Massachusetts has consistently earned recognition as home to one of the most successful and innovative education systems in the world. From early childhood learning to higher education, the Commonwealth has set benchmarks in academic achievement, equity initiatives, and workforce readiness. The session "Spotlight on Education in Massachusetts" brought together distinguished legislators, policymakers, and academic leaders to explore how the state built this success, the guiding principles behind its policies, and the pressing challenges it must address in the years ahead.

Key Themes and Discussions:

1. Massachusetts as a Global Leader in Education: Speakers highlighted how Massachusetts consistently ranks at the top nationally and globally in academic performance indicators. Central to this success are robust public investments, strong accountability systems, and an enduring commitment to teacher quality.

2. Policy Foundations and Legislative Vision: Alice Hanlon Peisch and Jason M. Lewis emphasized the importance of sustained legislative commitment in driving reforms. From landmark education funding initiatives to policies that close achievement gaps, legislative leaders in Massachusetts have been instrumental in shaping a system that balances excellence with equity.

3. Equity and Access in a Changing Landscape: Despite success, persistent challenges remain. Commissioner Pedro Martinez addressed disparities in educational

outcomes, particularly for low-income families, students of color, and English language learners.

4. Higher Education and Workforce Readiness: Paul Reville connected the conversation to higher education and the workforce pipeline. He argued that education must be seen as an integrated system, where K-12, vocational training, and universities work together to prepare students for productive and meaningful careers.

5. Community Engagement and Legislative Action: Senator Sal DiDomenico spoke on the importance of community-driven policies and the role of legislators in ensuring that families, educators, and local communities are part of the decision-making process. By building strong partnerships, Massachusetts has been able to design solutions that reflect both local needs and statewide goals.

Takeaways and Reflections:

The session underscored that the Massachusetts education system's success is no accident—it is the product of vision, persistence, and collaboration across multiple sectors. At the same time, the state acknowledges the challenges that remain inequities across districts, evolving workforce needs, and the demand for innovation in teaching and learning.

"Spotlight on Education in Massachusetts" ultimately offered participants a model of how legislative leadership, academic expertise, and community engagement can come together to produce sustained excellence.

Charlestown Navy Yard

The Charlestown Navy Yard, established in 1800 in Boston, Massachusetts, is one of the oldest shipbuilding facilities in the United States. It played a crucial role in U.S. naval history, constructing and repairing warships for over 174 years. Notably, it built the famous USS Constitution ("Old Ironsides"), launched in 1797, and the USS Cassin Young, a World War II destroyer. During the War of 1812, Civil War, and both World Wars, the yard was a hub of maritime innovation and defense. Decommissioned in 1974, it now forms part of the Boston National Historical Park, preserving naval heritage.

Pune (Maharashtra) [India], August 5: In a significant step toward strengthening global democratic engagement, a landmark delegation of over 130 Indian legislators will participate in the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) Summit in Boston, USA, from August 4 to 6, 2025. The initiative for Bharatiya delegation of legislators is being facilitated by National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat), a pioneering platform dedicated to empowering Indian legislators and fostering national and international legislative collaboration, cooperation and dialogue for sharing knowledge and best practices.

The delegation—comprising Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs) from over 24 Indian states and representing a diverse spectrum of 21 political parties—embodies the rich and inclusive tapestry of Bharat's democratic leadership. This historic journey began in 2024, when a pioneering group of 50 legislators participated in the Legislative Summit held in Louisville, USA—an initiative unprecedented in independent Bharat and undertaken neither by the government nor any other institution.

Rooted in the success of the inaugural NLC Bharat 2023 in Mumbai, this international visit is part of a long-term vision to create non-partisan, knowledge-driven platforms for legislators. At the NCSL Summit, legislators from Bharat will participate alongside over 2,000 U.S. legislators and more than 7000 legislators from different parts of the world in sessions addressing AI in governance, digital democracy, cybersecurity, voter confidence, and policy innovation.

Over 130 Indian MLAs & MLCs from 24 States, 21 Parties to Attend Global NCSL Summit in Boston, Facilitated by NLC Bharat 2025

In a significant step toward strengthening global democratic engagement, a landmark delegation of over 130 Indian legislators will participate in the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) Summit in Boston, USA, from August 4 to 6, 2025. The initiative for Bharatiya delegation of legislators is being facilitated by National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat), a pioneering platform dedicated to empowering Indian legislators and fostering national and international legislative collaboration, cooperation and dialogue for sharing knowledge and best practices.

The delegation—comprising Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs) from over 24 Indian states and representing a diverse spectrum of 21 political parties—embodies the rich and inclusive tapestry of Bharat's democratic leadership. This historic journey began in 2024, when a pioneering group of 50 legislators participated in the Legislative Summit held in Louisville, USA—an initiative unprecedented in independent Bharat and undertaken neither by the government nor any other institution.

Now, in a landmark moment, the delegation has grown to an unprecedented 130 legislators—marking the largest-ever Indian legislative presence at any global conference. This first-of-its-kind endeavour aims to foster cross-border learning, enhance legislative capacity, and provide exposure to international best practices in governance and lawmaking.

Rooted in the success of the inaugural NLC Bharat 2023 in Mumbai, this international visit is part of a long-term vision to create non-partisan, knowledge-driven platforms for legislators. At the NCSL Summit, legislators from Bharat will participate alongside over 2,000 U.S. legislators and more than 7000 legislators from different parts of the world in sessions addressing AI in governance, digital democracy, cybersecurity, voter confidence, and policy innovation.

Dr. Rahul Karad, Founder, NLC Bharat, said, "This is not just a delegation. It is a living expression of Bharat's democratic strength and unity in diversity — never before has such a large and representative group of Honourable MLAs and MLCs come together to engage the world on such a scale. What makes this moment even more special is the spirit behind it — the desire to learn, to grow, and to lead with wisdom and vision. When our legislators step into this international arena, they carry not only their personal aspirations, but the hopes of a billion citizens and the essence of an ancient civilization.
